**Fort Worth Tarrant County Branch of the NAACP On the March 25, 2026 Appointment of a New Board of Managers and Superintendent for Fort Worth ISD**

Fort Worth, TX - The Fort Worth Tarrant County Branch of the NAACP welcomes the appointment of a new Board of Managers and Superintendent to oversee the Fort Worth Independent School District and views this moment as a critical opportunity for transformational leadership. As a 92-year-old civil rights organization committed to educational equity, we remain steadfast in our mission to ensure that all children—without exception—have access to a high-quality, equitable public education.

We approach this transition with both optimism and urgency. Current academic outcomes, particularly for African American students, reflect a profound and longstanding inequity that must be addressed with intentional, student-centered action. When fewer than half of African American students are reading at grade level, this is not merely an academic concern—it is a civil rights issue that demands bold leadership, accountability, and systemic reform.

The NAACP expects the new Board and Superintendent to lead with a clear focus on children, equity, and measurable outcomes. This includes dismantling policies and practices that have contributed to underperforming schools, prioritizing literacy and academic achievement, and ensuring that resources, support, and opportunities are equitably distributed across the district. Educational success is not a privilege; it is a human right.

We stand ready to work collaboratively with district leadership, educators, families, and community partners to build a structure that supports academic excellence, transparency, and shared accountability. Our commitment is to advocate relentlessly for policies and practices that maximize student success and prepare every child in Fort Worth ISD to thrive academically and beyond.

This moment calls for courageous leadership and a renewed commitment to justice in education.
